Instrument Supplies

You are required to have the following supplies in class every day: instrument, pencil, and band folder with band book, class handouts, and music. Being prepared for class with the proper supplies is essential if our team is to succeed because EVERY MEMBER COUNTS.

The school provides band folders, music, and pencils; students provide band books. Band folders are replaced free of charge, if necessary, due to common "wear and tear." However, if you lose or mangle your band folder, you will be assessed \$1.00 for its replacement. As a team we must care for our equipment since much of it will be used for years to come, so do your part and respect your supplies.

The above-mentioned supplies are required for all students. However, you will also need additional supplies for instrument maintenance and care. You will learn how to care for your instrument in order to preserve your instrument, reduce repair costs, and improve your playing experience. The instrument-specific supplies listed below must be maintained at all times and may be purchased from me for the prices listed on page 4.

Although students will purchase instrument-specific supplies as needed throughout the school year, I made alternate arrangements for the initial purchase. I will distribute supply order forms during the second week of school. The order forms will show what supplies students must purchase and how much each supply costs. Please return your form along with the appropriate payment by Friday, September 20th. Supplies will be distributed soon thereafter. Please contact me if you are unable to return your payment by September 20th.

Practice Expectations

Playing an instrument is exciting, especially when you learn new songs and hear yourself improve. Like scholars and athletes, musicians require consistent and productive practice in order to excel. Thus, you will practice at home. You will receive weekly practice logs that explain your practicing assignments and teach you how to practice effectively. After you complete the assignments on your practice logs, you will submit your practicing homework using Google Voice. Simply call 734.743.2263, follow the prompts, and record your homework as described on your practice logs. I will listen to your recordings and provide written feedback. Practice makes perfect, so prepare to sound amazing!

Assessment

Students will earn letter grades in band. Band letter grades will appear on students' official report cards and may be monitored in Power School. Grades are based on students' completion of weekly practice logs {50%}, attendance in class with proper supplies {30%}, and proficiency on playing tests {20%}. Please see page 4 for an explanation of weekly practice expectations and page 2 for a list of the supplies students must bring to class. There will be one playing test per trimester. Attend class, complete your work, fulfill your responsibilities, and try your hardest. You will surely succeed!
